Opening Reflection by the Revd David Featonby Convenor of the Lay Ministries Group

Trust and Obey

Back in the 1960s, I used to attend a local **Crusader** group (now called <u>Urban Saints</u>). Every Sunday afternoon, about 40 boys gathered to learn about the Bible and sing 'choruses', usually just one-verse hymns. One song that I remember very well was '<u>Trust and obey</u>', the words of which have stuck with me over the succeeding years. It was only some time later that I discovered the words were the refrain from a five-verse hymn, the first of which I quote here:


When we walk with the Lord in the light of His Word
What a glory He sheds on our way!
While we do His good will, He abides with us still
And with all who will trust and obey.
Trust and obey, for there's no other way
To be happy in Jesus, but to trust and obey.

But it was those key words, 'trust and obey,' that resonated with me then as they have throughout my life.

We are living in days where truth seems in short supply. From the very apex of public life to the ordinary person in the street spreading gossip and conspiracy theories, it is challenging to know who or what we can trust. The **Covid 19** enquiry has revealed some disturbing facts, some even challenging the advice we were given at the time. In the United States, the evangelical right-wing church led an anti-vaccination campaign, which led to the tragic death of some of their members. So who can we really trust?

I literally thank God that truth is to be found in the person of Jesus Christ. When the disciples were concerned and confused with Jesus' behaviour, especially his talking of suffering and death on a cross, Thomas asked him, "we do not know where you are going, so how can we know the way?" (John 14:5). To which Jesus responded with one of the best-known verses in the Bible, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life."

We test a person's trustworthiness by their ethics, their integrity, their words and actions and truthfulness. The Jesus that we meet in the Gospels strikes me as one we can fully trust and follow his teachings. Jesus isn't claiming to be a truth. Rather THE truth. Jesus is not only true, he is truth itself.



There are lots of other people and religions claiming to have the truth. Jesus is making an exclusive claim here that he embodies all things that are true and that we can put our faith and our lives confidently in his hands. Our response is to obey his teachings to the best of our abilities and with the help of the Holy Spirit. Of course, we will fall short from time to time, but because we can trust Jesus, we know that if our hearts are right, we will be forgiven for our frailty and shortcomings.

An important aspect of our obedience is to be truthful and

trustworthy ourselves, both in our personal lives and in our corporate church life.

So if you are exhausted with the lies and distortion of the truth emanating from those who should know better, comfort yourself in the knowledge that Jesus Christ is the truth and we can have every confidence in following him.

Holiday Club at Matlock Methodist and United Reformed Church



Matlock Methodist and United Reformed Church is celebrating the success of the extended summer operations of its Toddler Stay and Play Group, which were supported by a Small Grant from the URC's Children's and Youth Work Office.

The Stay and Play Group has long stayed open for part of the summer holidays for pre-school children, but the church's Mission and Outreach worker identified the need for a church in Matlock to provide summer holiday activities for older children: both the big brothers and sisters of the toddlers who attend the group now, and those who came when they were younger. Alongside the toys for the younger children, it provided craft activities for those of Primary School age and hospitality for their parents.

Over four weekly sessions, the activities explored the story of Moses. Each week a tableau was set up in the welcome hall to show the children the story they were about to learn about: first Moses as a baby, then the burning bush, the

ten plagues and finally the parting of the Red Sea. At the end of each session, they took their own storyboards and their craft items home as a lasting reminder.

For the church, this was also part of a process reviewing how to reorganise its activities, in order to make best use of a large and cost-intensive building to focus on its mission. To help establish what works, the summer Stay and Play sessions were held in the sanctuary rather than the community rooms. Many parents commented on how welcoming they found both the space and people and overall the experiment was judged a great success.


URC Advent Resource


There's a giant poster, four mini-books, stained glass windows to colour and lots of ideas for things to do, all in an envelope which may be used for invitations to church events.
