Opening Reflection by Richard Knott

Children and Youth Development Officer

This weekend the **URC Youth Assembly** takes place at Whitemoor Lakes. The Youth Assembly is a community that is always a buzz of excitement, meeting up with friends, being away for the weekend, being able to discuss and debate issues on your own agenda, young adults leading the event at every stage and together worshipping God and growing in faith.



Being a young person following
Christ can be a difficult experience:
there is much cynicism in society
today about the claims of the
Christian faith, much suspicion about
institutions such as the Church, and
many pressures that young people
cope with every day. It is to be
celebrated then that over 100 young
people will gather at URC Youth

Assembly to share much-needed fellowship, to debate and discuss issues and to worship together as members of URC Youth.

This year we have a smaller group from the Synod attending than last year. Some have grown beyond the age bracket, others who are eligible felt unable to attend due to exam pressures and so perhaps, in a way, like many local churches have experienced we have fewer young people attending from the Synod than may have been hoped. It is a reminder if ever we needed it, of the challenges we face in reaching a generation with the good news.

What can I do, you might be asking? I encourage you to pray: to pray for the young people that you might be connected with in some way. If you are blessed to have them as participants in your worshipping community pray for them, or for those in your wider family, those who live, work or study in your community. Perhaps ask God to show you and to place on your heart one or two young people that you can pray for regularly.



For this weekend I invite you to pray:

- for the young people and the support team involved
- for our own Synod Youth Rep Billy as he is welcomed into the URC Youth Executive and for all the Executive members
- that everyone experiences fun, laughter and enjoyment
- that everyone is safe in all aspects

- that everyone would experience a warm welcome and friendship
- that God's presence would be known and experienced by all
- for the **Youth Leaders' Gathering** that takes place alongside Youth Assembly, that each leader will be encouraged, inspired and supported.

interest.





The **United Reformed Church** is undergoing a process of change - and needs volunteers who are keen to help forge the path ahead.




