Opening Reflection by Dr Graham Jennings Clerk of the East Midlands Synod

This September, we wish all our children, young people, teachers, lecturers - indeed everyone involved with the start of the new academic year - every good wish for the coming term.

Of course, this month does not correlate with the start of the liturgical or Church year but often, for our congregations, it does feel like the beginning of a new cycle of activity after the summer break. I wonder if we are looking forward to these coming months with excitement or perhaps with a degree of trepidation.



Any new start - a new job; a new school; a move to a new home; to university; starting a family - can be exciting but also daunting and can even feel overwhelming or threatening. This can also be true in our churches when new projects or other significant changes are being considered or even simply when a new session begins.

Along with a number of recently appointed Synod colleagues this summer, I have experienced a new start as I began to take on new responsibilities as Clerk. This has been made so much easier due to the help and support of so many present and past members of Synod staff and the essential volunteers. I sincerely thank them all for this assistance.

In reporting on the **Church Life Review** at General Assembly 2023, the **Revd Dr John Bradbury**, our General Secretary, suggested that resourcing our Local Churches as effectively as we can is the primary strategic purpose of Assembly and Synods. This aligns perfectly with the vision of the East Midlands Synod.

Although new to the role of Clerk, I have been present at many Synod Meetings as a church representative when it has been a joy to hear other churches' "Good News Stories". Frequently, the good work of the congregations has benefited significantly from the support of Synod - sometimes financially but more often due to the equally important if less tangible support of Pastoral Consultants and the other Synod personnel and volunteers: e.g. the officers, the moderator, local networkers, and all the others who carry out essential work "behind the scenes". All these people are committed to helping our churches flourish because they are all part of the One Church of Christ Jesus.

At a point in the year when we might be thinking about new starts and challenges ahead, it is perhaps good to be reminded of the support that is there for our churches. Challenges ahead might transform into opportunities when they are not faced alone, particularly where we can connect with others who may have experienced something similar and discovered effective responses from which we can all benefit.


Ron Kenyon OBE Retires as Director and Chair of EMS Trust

Olney Churches Holiday Bible Club 2023

The Revd Chris Parker shares the following report:

From 7 - 11 August the combined churches of **Olney** held their annual **Holiday Bible Club**, "On Safari". Around 100 children aged from 5 to 12 years came every day, helped by leaders from all four churches (Baptist, Anglican, URC and Catholic). **Sutcliffe Baptist Church** was our base for starting and finishing the mornings, with the 5 to 6-year-olds staying in the building for their group activities, 7 to 8's going to **Cowper Memorial URC** and the 9 to 12's walking to the **Parish Church** for their groups.





Thankfully the weather was good all week so walking and games could take place outside.

As well as the age groups the together time featured much singing, messy games, prayer, and an excellent daily drama from the young people who had been practising since Easter. We also were taught the Lord's Prayer bit by bit each day with added actions.

The week concluded with a free family BBQ, and it was lovely to see happy children with their parents and carers. It was also brilliant to share God's love with the community and a real privilege to see and hear the spirituality of the children. Thanks to all involved.

Places of Worship Protective Security Funding Scheme

As announced recently by the government, places of worship are to receive **£28 million** in funding to help keep them and their attendees safe where they have experience of hate crime.

The funding is part of the government's commitment to ensure that faith communities in England and Wales are protected from the threat of hate crime and terror attacks and can practise their faith freely and without fear.



Practical Ideas and Tips for Protecting Creation

Green Christian has not 3, not 5. but <u>7 R's</u> for finding joy in God's Creation!



The threats to our planet, which climate and environmental scientists have been warning us of for decades, can now be seen with our own eyes: the plastic in the oceans, the loss of garden insects (notably butterflies) and birds and the extreme weather events and wildfires, which are increasing in number and ferocity.

This year and next, **El Niño** (a warming of surface water in the Pacific Ocean) might add significantly to climate chaos; it is too early to predict how strong **El Niño** will be or whether global warming will (temporarily) pass 1.5°C next year, but some scientists are worried.

As Christians, we commit to lives of loving service, including protecting God's wonderful Creation. And yet on every side we're bombarded by clever advertising, cunningly designed to encourage us to buy more and travel to exciting places. But almost every purchase or distant travel has a carbon footprint, uses up resources and pollutes the earth. We can live more simply and find joy in the free gifts that God gives us.

We can:

Rejoice	in all that God has given us
Refuse	to believe the advertisements
Reduce	buy less, travel less, worry less
Reuse	love and reuse things for years
Repair	value sewing & repairing skills
Rent	or borrow or share
Recycle	but only as a last resort!

(enjoy our local patch of nature)
(wait 24 h before buying something)
(ring-fence quality time with others)
(try charity shops, Freecycle, freegle)
(invest: sewing kit & superglue tube)
(and lend something in return)
(and buy recycled items if possible)

Black Light Course – Back for Autumn 2023

Urban expression is once more partnering with the Ascension Trust to host another Black Light Course.



What's it about? It explores the presence and contributions of black people in the Bible, in church history and in Britain today. It celebrates the remarkable growth of the church in Africa and the exciting 'reverse mission' impact on Europe. It does not shy away from looking at the legacies of Christendom and colonialism, but it invites creativity and courage in seizing the opportunities that are emerging.

Is it political? No more than Jesus himself was political in the things he said and did, the way he challenged the status quo, his announcement of a new politics, which he called 'the kingdom of God.'

Is it guilt-inducing? No, that's not the aim, but it is challenging, inviting us to recover lost aspects of our histories, to reflect on our attitudes and relationships, and to ask what it means to follow Jesus in a multi-ethnic society.

Who is it for? Anyone interested in these topics, but especially for church leaders, youth leaders, mission leaders – actually, anyone interested in evangelism, justice, healthy churches and peaceful communities.

What's the agenda? There is no hidden agenda, but one of our hopes is that the course will not only inform but inspire, challenge and equip, and result in new forms of partnership between black and white Christians and churches in seeking the kingdom of God in our nation. That's the focus of the final session in the course.
