Opening Reflection by the Revd Geoffrey Clarke East Midlands Synod Moderator

Bear one another's burdens, and in this way you fulfil the law of Christ.

Galatians 6:2

In one of my all-time favourite prayers, **Giles & Melville Harcourt** speak for many of us when they pray:

God of our life, there are days when the burdens we carry chafe our shoulders and weigh us down:

when the road seems dreary and endless, the skies grey and threatening:

when our lives have no music in them, and our hearts are lonely, and our souls have lost their courage.

(Short Prayers for the Long Day, compiled by Giles & Melville Harcourt, 1978)

The burdens we carry chafe our shoulders and weigh us down. Certainly, ministry and church life can feel like a burden – heavy, weighty, worrisome. And, rather like that children's game, Buckaroo – in which players are challenged to stack as much as they can on to the mule until it starts kicking – many of us can be excused for concluding that, in the words of this prayer, there are days – and these current days are such days – when the burdens we carry chafe our shoulders, weigh us down and that we are dangerously close to collapsing under their weight. Compliance, safeguarding, health and safety, financial commitments soaring through the roof... these and so much more are responsibilities so heavy we can feel utterly weighed down.


St Paul urges the members of the church at Galatia both to *bear one another's burdens* (v2) ... and *to carry their own loads* (v5). In short: to bear one another's burdens and also to take responsibility for their own.

A cursory search for words associated with "burden" results in a daunting list of challenges: anxiety, concern, difficulty, duty, hardship, load, onus, responsibility, strain, task, tax, trouble, worry, afflict, bother, depress, encumber, hamper, handicap, hinder. It doesn't matter whether "burden" is a noun or a verb: it is still heavy!

Beyond any impact that might be made by the most brilliant of sermons and the finest of words, people will be touched and blessed most as and when they see and know the followers of Christ to be committed to burden-bearing and load-carrying. All the more so as we all face the crushing burden of the eye-watering sums of money being demanded of us for heat and light. We may, some of us, find church to be a place where burdens are placed upon us but we must never become so self-absorbed as ministers, elders and members that we lose sight of our call to do what we can to assist others – within and without the walls of the church – to avoid being weighed down and crushed by the tough challenges of life.

These are tough times – a marathon rather than a leisurely stroll – but we are urged to bear the burdens together. Our Roman Catholic partners are currently engaged in a Synod process at the invitation of **Pope**Francis – reflecting on what the Church needs to become in these changed days. I conclude by sharing a

quote from Pope Francis that sits well with our own expectations of our own Synod family dispersed across East Midlands:

On Saturday 30 July, Mackworth URC hosted a **Service of Celebration** to bless the **A2C Church Related Community Work project** as it embarked upon its second 5-year term. **Ashbourne Road Church** and **Mackworth URC** are the Churches-in-Community and **Vicky Longbone** is the CRCW. The service was conducted by Synod Moderator the **Revd Geoffrey Clarke**, with **Miss Ali Stacey-Chapman** as preacher.

We pray for every success for Vicky and the two churches in this new phase of vital work in the community. For an example of her recent work, read on.

A voice for the voiceless

Of all the groups run by **Derby A2C**, perhaps the most exciting is the **School Holiday Food Project**. Started four years ago, this service runs three days a week in every school break, offering hot meals, breakfast parcels and a variety of activities to support families who are struggling with children at home full-time.



This summer the Project supported 25 families. As well as providing food parcels through its foodbank, it tries to ensure that every child gets a day out and will have something to write about should teachers ask them what they did in their summer holidays. This year, the Project laid on a coach trip to an animal sanctuary, with lunch and £5 spending money provided. After brushing the horses and taking the ferrets and llamas for a walk, the children enjoyed a couple of hours on the beach at Skegness beach – all paid for through the generosity of listeners to **BBC Radio Derby**.



Community Related Project Worker Vicky Longbone was initially asked to appear on BBC News 24, at one hour's notice, to discuss the work of the Derby Food4Thought Alliance. This led to an invitation from Radio Derby's Sunday breakfast show to outline the struggles of working families. She appeared again at her own request when news broke of the increase in the energy price cap, challenging the Prime Minister to try living in the "real world", where parents are already going without in order to keep their children fed.

She explained why taking families out for the day was so important – and within 24 hours, listeners raised £1000 to pay for the coach trip.

Vicky says:

"Whilst raising the money was fantastic, it's getting the voice of the voiceless out there that's most important. From people who have contacted me since being on the radio, many seem to live in a bubble, or think they've got it bad, without knowing how bad others have it. That this is often happening to low paid workers, not people on benefits, not people who abuse the system. I hear and see some horrendous situations through the foodbank and the general public need to know how bad it really is. I feel blessed that I was in the right place at the right time for this opportunity. I will not stop."



Important: New Regulations on Smoke Detectors and Carbon Monoxide Alarms

The Regulations regarding the fitting of **smoke detectors and carbon monoxide alarms** in rented property are changing as from Saturday 1 October. Please see the article below, received from one of our letting agents.

The **Smoke and Carbon Monoxide Alarm (Amendment) Regulations 2022** will come into force on the 1st October 2022. From that date, all relevant Landlords must:

- 1. Ensure at least one smoke alarm is fitted on each storey of their homes where there is a room used as living accommodation. This has been a legal requirement in the private rented sector since 2015.
- 2. Ensure a carbon monoxide alarm is fitted in any room used as living accommodation which contains a fixed combustion appliance (excluding gas cookers).
- 3. Ensure smoke alarms and carbon monoxide alarms are repaired or replaced once informed and found that they are faulty.

As we have a duty of care towards ministers and CRCWs living in manses, please make sure that manses under your care are fitted with the appropriate alarms and that they are checked at least once a month!

The cost of fitting these alarms is not significant, but in any event they could save lives. Please make sure that our ministers and CRCWs are living in safer properties by making sure these alarms are installed as soon as possible.

East Africa Humanitarian Disaster

East Africa faces a humanitarian disaster – but it's not too late to act!

The heatwave that impacted several parts of the UK recently was a stark reminder to many that climate change is warming the world and creating, in some countries, huge problems.

In **Kenya, Ethiopia** and **Somalia**, communities are experiencing the worst drought in 40 years with four consecutive failed rainy seasons, causing a hunger crisis for millions of vulnerable people. According to United Nations Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs, 18.4m people across the three countries are missing meals.

Yitna Tekaligne, Country Director for Christian Aid Ethiopia, warns "millions are taking desperate measures to survive in the face of failed harvests, livestock deaths, water shortages and extreme hunger."

He adds: "The severe conditions are being made worse by the climate crisis, covid and now Russia's invasion of Ukraine which has caused global food prices to rocket. A tough situation has now turned into a dire crisis."

In response to this crisis, **Christian Aid** has just launched an emergency appeal for East Africa. The charity is working through local partners to respond in Ethiopia and Kenya. Together they are helping over 300,000 people by repairing wells, distributing water purification kits, providing cash support, and trucking water to drought affected communities as well as providing fodder and medicine to keep valuable livestock alive.

With money raised from the appeal, **Christian Aid** is also calling for the UK Government to speed up the delivery of funding that has already been promised to the region.

Karimi Kinoti, who is based in Kenya and is **Christian Aid's interim Policy, Public Affairs and Campaigns Director**, says, "The response to humanitarian needs in Ukraine has been remarkable. The UK Government must now live up to its moral responsibility and urgently act in that same spirit for East Africa. Every day that we delay will make it more difficult to avoid tragedy.

"Ministers must speed up the delivery of funding that has already been promised, reverse cuts to international aid and ensure all humanitarian and development funding supports local actors who are best placed to respond quickly.

"Longer term, we must tackle the impact of the climate crisis on global hunger by delivering on climate finance promises, including new money for loss and damage. By taking these steps, we ensure this crisis does not deteriorate into a catastrophe."


