## Opening Reflection by the Revd Camilla Veitch Clerk of the East Midlands Synod

#### New Year - New Dawn

Have you made any New Year's resolutions? I haven't – because I know I wouldn't be good at keeping them! Even so, a new year brings with it a sense of anticipation and starting afresh. We wonder what lies ahead and what the next 12 months will bring. It's like looking out of the window when the world has been covered in snow and no one has yet made any footprints in it. 

## **Around the East Midlands**

**Wellingborough United Reformed Church** – also known within the community as High Street, or "the Congo" - shares news of last month's **Christmas Tree Festival:** 



The weekend of 11 and 12 December 2021 saw High Street URC join in with the Christmas celebrations throughout the town.

Our first Christmas Tree Festival was a real success. It answered questions from Facebook such as:

"Is the Congo still open?"

"We got married there and I would like to see it again."

"Is it open during the week?"

"Why is called the Pork Pie church?"

It gave us another chance, after lockdown, to say, "Yes we are open! Come and see!"

Christmas trees were contributed by local businesses, schools, groups, individuals from church, the Library, the town council, a Hindu temple, Multifaith and Victoria Centre, to mention but a few of the 40 trees that formed a dazzling display.







It was even more special as the daylight faded and the lights were dimmed.

We were able to serve hot drinks and cupcakes. Covid rules were strictly followed: in on the left, follow the arrows and exit on the right. Masks and hand sanitiser all available. The **Wellingborough Afro Caribbean Association** (WACA) ran away with the competition for favourite tree, with a joyous riot of colours, voted for by all the visitors.

Others showed themes of recycling, caring for society and Bumps, Babies and Toddlers. A delighted 3-year-old exclaimed, "I made an angel and it is here!"

Christmas trees were also made from plastic four-pint milk bottles, wood off-cuts and what looked like coat hangers!

A total of 210 people - not counting the children - came in and we raised awareness of the Hub Project, collecting £870 as a result. People were fascinated by the model made by Jim, a church member – not forgetting the lovely organ music played by Terry.





It is with great sadness that we bring news of the death of the following retired ministers. We give thanks to God for all that has been achieved through their lives and ministries.

The **North West Synod** regretfully informs us of the death of the **Revd Geoff Tolley**, a retired minister, who died on Friday 17 December 2021. Geoff was ordained in 1967 and served at: Adlington (1967-1979); Bank Top, Bolton (1968-1979); Bolton North Group (1979-1986); Darwen Group (1986-2001); Revidge Fold and Trinity Blackburn (2002-2006). Geoff leaves his wife Edith and family, and we hold them in our prayers.

It is with sadness that the **East Midlands Synod** announces the death of retired minister **Revd Margaret Taylor** on Christmas Eve, 24 December 2021. Margaret was the first woman to be accepted for training and ordination by the Presbyterian Church of England at Westminster College. It is with deep sadness that the United Reformed Church announced in December the death of **Peter Pay, Moderator of the URC General Assembly**, a former Synod Clerk and an Assembly Accredited Lay Preacher who was a member of Salisbury URC.


Mr Pay had been living with a malignant brain tumour for some time and had bravely continued with his commitments until he was forced to step back towards the latter part of 2021. He died on Saturday 18 December.

The **Revd Clare Downing**, who served as Moderator of the URC General Assembly jointly with Mr Pay, said: "Peter has been a valued colleague and friend in various capacities over the years. His clear thinking and ability to ask pertinent questions has been a real asset to the life of the United Reformed Church. He brought a serious mind, tempered by a well-developed sense of humour to dealing with difficult issues. He will be much missed within Wessex Synod, the wider URC, and ecumenical partners."


