The prayer for Walking the Way makes a good place to begin a reflection on General Assembly 2018. The emphasis on discipleship permeated every corner of both the worship and the business of Assembly. The morning Bible studies had us accompanying Abram and Moses and walking through the desert with Isaiah's words. Our own Revd Jenny Mills walked with an umbrella to present the Youth and Children's work report and there was the usual mix of people who reluctantly walked to the microphone and those who were eager to contribute to debate and ensuring that our wording was grammatical.

I was proud of the young people who helpfully contributed to many of the debates and of the many East Midlands church members who gave time and energy to act as stewards ensuring that everything ran smoothly. The weekend wasn't the most promising for debating the issues we had before us. I resisted the temptation to check the exact figure on a thermometer but the provision of water fountains was more than necessary and freshair breaks were absolutely necessary. To set against the heat and the intensity of the programme we heard positive reflections and encouragement from the immediate past moderators and our new team of moderators too. John Proctor's preaching on Sunday morning was inspiring, as well as the read reflection which preceded it. I could list the business but you can check that on the website if you'd like to see what was discussed. For me one of the high spots was the interfaith conversation that took place on Sunday afternoon. It was a joy to listen to a rabbi, a vicar and a sparky Muslim woman seeking common ground and being disciples in their own traditions, walking in authentic yet different ways.

May discipleship be for you an exciting, fulfilling, authentic journey.

#### **DERBYSHIRE**

The congregation at **Melbourne United Reformed Church** were treated to a summer surprise on Sunday 1<sup>st</sup> July when their Minister, Revd Marcus Hargis, set up a pop-up one-day art gallery. Featuring fourteen ceramic sculptures by Marcus himself, the exhibition gave people a taste of his work in fine Parian porcelain.

At the morning and evening services, Marcus spoke about his sense of calling in creating ceramics and how he got started, saying: "About five years back, I was living near the Potteries area of Stoke-on-Trent and I ministered to a church almost opposite Josiah Wedgwood's house. I thought that it would be a good idea to learn more about pottery. So I did a short course and was hooked!"

After much experimentation, Marcus has arrived at his style in which he hand-forms each piece; shaping, cutting and joining pieces together. He continued, "Life is full of fractures: it's what we make of them that matters. Beauty can be born in brokenness, imperfection can be interesting, and asymmetry can lead to unity."

Each ceramic is untitled so that people can see what they want to. Geraldine was asked about a piece that caught her eye and she said: "I was drawn to this one in particular. It reminds me of the seaside: it's the shape of a shell, blue like the sea, with the white of the waves."
