Good news! You will have heard of the recent special report by the United Nations Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change. Maybe you thought of Isaiah 62:5 – 'Upon your walls, O Jerusalem, I have posted sentinels.' Climate scientists (some literally in tears) warned that we must make every effort to limit global warming to 1.5 degrees C. What particularly struck me is the very clear link made with eliminating global grinding poverty. On the one hand, meeting the Sustainable Development Goals is essential to limit global warming. On the other hand, the climate change following a temperature rise of 2 degrees C will have 'negative consequences' for hundreds of millions of poor people.

The trumpet call is good news because there is still (just) time to act to prevent catastrophe! There is indeed hope that, with God's help, we can change the wasteful life-styles of the rich nations (= us). We are, however, warned against 'cheap grace' and there is no room for 'cheap hope'. Look at the heart-rending devastation resulting from an earth-quake and tsunami in Sulawesi or the millions of children on the brink of starvation as a consequence of the wicked war in Yemen. I'm sure that many churches will be raising funds to do what we can to help, but we will be overwhelmed by the needs unless global warming is controlled. That is why the JPIC Group commends congregations to register with Eco Church and lovingly to integrate resolute care for God's Creation within their worship and action.



DISASTERS EMERGENCY COMMITTEE (DEC) LAUNCHES INDONESIA TSUNAMI APPEAL

Leading UK aid agencies (including Christian Aid), have launched a joint fundraising appeal to help the survivors of the 7.4 magnitude earthquake and tsunami that struck Central Sulawesi Province, Indonesia, the Friday before. Over 1,300 people are confirmed dead and 200,000 people are in urgent need of clean water, food, medical care and shelter.

Homes and entire communities have been destroyed after the earthquake and a tsunami with waves travelling at over 400 miles per hour left a trail of destruction in their wake in one of the worst Indonesian disasters since the 2004 Boxing Day tsunami.

As rescuers struggle to reach outlying communities, authorities fear that casualties and the number of people displaced by the disaster will rise in the coming days. Up to 1.5 million people may have been affected. The DEC Indonesia Tsunami Appeal was launched on 4th October and was shown on all major UK broadcasters including BBC, ITV, Channel 4, Channel 5 and Sky.

THE UNITED REFORMED CHURCH - Educational Visit to Israel & Palestine 18-28 September 2019

Successful applicants will participate in a guided educational visit to Israel, the occupied West Bank, annexed East Jerusalem and Golan Heights, to learn about their peoples, religions, politics and cultures. There will be a particular focus on meeting with Palestinian Christians, in order to appreciate the immense challenges faced by the indigenous churches and their members. The visit will explore some of the principal historical sites relating to the Abrahamic faiths. There will be periods of reflection and bible study throughout, and especially by the Sea of Galilee towards the end of the visit. Experienced guides will accompany the party.

Funding has been secured to cover flights, transfers, accommodation, meals and transport whilst in Israel and Palestine. Successful applicants will be responsible for providing personal spending money, and for the arrangements and costs of internal UK travel [and accommodation, if necessary] prior to the outward flight from London Luton Airport and following arrival of the return flight. In addition, each person will be required to commit to raising £500 towards the cost of the visit. Participants are not expected to fund this amount from personal finances but to raise the money locally, as this will raise awareness of the purpose of the visit.

It is hoped that the group will include one representative from each synod and two from URC Youth. There will be three leaders plus General Assembly Moderator, Derek Estill. Synod representatives will be selected by application form. The aim is to put together a diverse group of experience and backgrounds. The visit is open to both lay and ordained people. Applicants are **not** required to have great prior knowledge of Israel and Palestine. **But** participants will be expected to prepare in advance and to share experience and learning from the visit widely within their synod on return. One practical point, the itinerary will be physically demanding; there will a good deal of walking, sometimes on steep and uneven surfaces with many steps to climb!

WORSHIP MATERIAL FOR REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY

A unique resource has been published on the URC website, available as a downloadable pdf. For over 60 years the URC has had a Covenant of Pulpit and Table Fellowship with the Protestant Churches in the Palatinate region of Germany, the 'Evangelische Kirche der Pfalz'. Drawing on this partnership for the 100 years commemoration of the 1918 Armistice, the URC have been working with our German partners to produce a shared resource, which can be downloaded as two separate booklets.

Entitled 'One hundred years after the First World War: Looking back, looking forward', the first booklet contains personal stories, reflections and poems written by British and German contributors. It includes a pilgrimage to the Somme this year undertaken by Pfarrer Martin Henninger from the Pfalz and the Revd David Pickering, Moderator of the Synod in Scotland. Their grandparents served on opposing sides during World War One. An accompanying booklet provides worship material: meditation, prayers, newly written hymns and biblical reflections and closes with a commitment to peace building.
