It is good to see the afternoons staying lighter for longer. Although it is, of course, an annual phenomenon and nothing new it still crops up in conversations to the extent. On late afternoon walks with the dog it makes a change to remark, "It's staying light longer" rather than "It's cold (or warm) today".

In her wonderful book, *One hundred wisdom stories from around the world*, Margaret Silf shares the tale of *Signs of Daybreak*:

A rabbi once asked his students how they could tell when night had ended and day was on its way back

'Is it when you can see an animal in the distance, and can tell whether it is a sheep or a dog?' 'No,' answered the rabbi.

'Is it when you can look at a tree in the distance, and tell whether it is a fig tree or a peach tree?' 'No.'

'Well then,' the students demanded, 'when is it?'

'It is when you look on the face of another human being and see that he or she is your brother or sister. Because if you cannot do that, then no matter what time it is, it is still night.'

At the current time, when there appears to be an unhealthy flourishing of sectarianism, it is tempting to conclude that we are still living in the dark and daybreak is far off. As people of faith, affirming that every person is our neighbour, we have a vital contribution to make. It is not an easy or simple task – or one that will win acclaim and applause - but unless we speak up and speak out only the hostile voices of division will be heard. The world and the limit of our love and kindness must not be as small as 'our people' or 'those who agree with us'.

May God enable us to be willing to look on the face of other human beings and to see therein the face of Christ, our brother. Doing so will certainly hasten the coming of daybreak.
