It features the Assembly Moderator, Mr Derek Estill, with Rev Kate Gray, Green Apostle for North Western Synod, and others when they visited the protestors at the Cuadrilla fracking site at Preston New Road in Lancashire. The URC has not yet taken a formal position on fracking but many of us feel that fracking is incompatible with the urgent need to reduce carbon emissions rapidly to zero. The JPIC Group was encouraged both by an inspiring presentation by Mr Simeon Mitchell of Church and Society and the Joint Public Issues Team and by the unanimous resolution of Synod on Saturday to register as an Eco Synod and to work with local churches towards the achievement of an award. Already 8% of U.R.C. churches in the East Midlands have registered with Eco Church and we hope that this decision will inspire many more.
