And with the blasts from the shofar (ram's horn), the two-day Jewish celebration of the Rosh Hashanah, or Jewish New Year, began earlier this week. It literally means 'the head of the year', and the biblical name for this holiday is Yom Teruah, or 'day of shouting or blasting', hence all the noise. It seems to me that this is a very timely celebration as it is the last e-letter that I will be writing before I retire from stipendiary ministry in December, as it will be a time of celebration for us and the beginning of something new. However, there is much more to this holiday than at first meets the eye. Rosh Hashanah begins on the first day of Tishrei, the seventh month of the ecclesiastical year, but it is preceded by the month of Elul, during which time Jews are supposed to begin a self-examination and repentance, which is a process that culminates in the ten days of the Yamin Nora'im, or the Ten Days of Awe, which begin with Rosh Hashanah and end with the holiday of Yom Kippur. Yom Kippur is the holiest day of the year—the day on which we are closest to God and to the very essence of our own souls. It is the Day of Atonement—"For on this day He will forgive you, to purify you, that you be cleansed from all your sins". And figuratively speaking, this is where I am now - in the month of Elul, that place of waiting before the new year and a new beginning, wondering where it will take me and looking forward to new challenges. So, while our Jewish friends enjoy their new year celebrations, may we each reflect on the past and look forward to a coming new year with self-examination, faith and confidence in God's plan for

Breakfast @ Synod


