



Next Moderator of East Midlands Synod Nominated



Revd Geoffrey Clarke has been nominated to serve as the next Moderator of East Midlands Synod. Geoffrey is presently minister of The Crossing Church, Worksop and Wales Kiveton Methodist Church, both in Nottinghamshire. He had previously served churches in Seaton Delaval in Northern Synod and Trinity Cheadle in North West Synod.

The Assembly Nominating Group which made the recommendation was impressed by many fine qualities in Geoffrey: his experience of 27 years of pastoral ministry; substantial spells of service as Synod Clerk in the North West and Deputy Moderator in the East Midlands, and the high respect he has gained in both these roles; deep and broad ecumenical understanding; detailed knowledge of the Synod, its structures and staffing, and many of its people and churches; thoughtful pastoral insight; and a tested and honest personal spirituality.

Geoffrey's name will be brought to the United Reformed Church's Mission Council in March, which has the power to ratify this nomination as a formal appointment of the Church.

He will begin his term as Moderator on 1st May 2020, for an initial term of seven years.

Geoffrey will stand down as Deputy Moderator of Synod from the end of December in order to prepare for this new role. Please remember him in your prayers.

TRANSITIONAL ARRANGEMENTS FOR MODERATORIAL COVER

Synod has put arrangements in place to provide moderatorial cover until Geoffrey takes up his post as Moderator on 1st May.

Essential tasks will be covered by a team of three people: Revd George Mwaura, minister of Christ the Cornerstone Local Ecumenical Partnership, Milton Keynes, Revd Dr Peter Stevenson, minister of ChristChurch Local Ecumenical Partnership Grantham and Stamford United Reformed Church, and Mrs Helen Lidgett, Synod Clerk. They will have the advice and support as necessary from Revd Steve Faber, Moderator of West Midlands Synod, and Revd Kevin Watson, Moderator of Yorkshire Synod.

George will be available to provide pastoral support to ministers. Peter will chair the March Synod meeting and meetings of Synod Council. Helen will oversee the ongoing work of the Synod. Ministers are advised to contact the office as usual to report sick leave or other pastoral concerns, such as requests for compassionate leave. Hannah Willey will direct queries to the appropriate person. Local churches - there is no change! Your first port of call is your Pastoral Consultant who will either deal with the issue themselves or refer it on if they need additional advice or help. Safeguarding issues should be reported to Jane Henderson, the Synod Safeguarding Officer, as usual.

RURAL MINISTRY COURSE

Our highly-regarded Rural Ministry Course is back!

The Rural Ministry Course is designed for *lay and ordained church leaders across the denominations entering a rural appointment for the first time, and those already *in rural ministry who feel the need for a 'refresher'.

The three-day residential programme employs a variety of approaches including practical sessions, group work and workshops led by practitioners, and includes sessions on understanding rural contexts, mission and growth, leadership, farming and work with children and young people in the countryside. Launched in 1982, the course provided training for hundreds of rural church leaders for almost four decades before it was briefly paused in 2017. After a period of review and updating, we are delighted that the course is returning in 2020.

We are running what amounts to a pilot course from Tues 11 – Thurs 13 February

2020, lunchtime to lunchtime, at King's Park Conference Centre in Northampton. This course will cost £250 to reflect the fact that this is a pilot; the fees include a one-year subscription to Country Way magazine.

We will be running a second course from Mon 8 – Wed 10 June 2020; the fees for this will be £300 and will also include a one-year subscription to Country Way magazine.
