ECO-CHURCH SILVER AWARD FOR ST ANDREW'S CHESTERFIELD

St Andrew's has achieved an Eco-Church Silver Award for its achievements in becoming an environmentally friendly church and congregation.

The story began 10 years ago when we transferred gas and electricity supplies to Ecotricity and undertook a detailed survey of the premises to identify ways to improve insulation and use electricity more efficiently. This proved a lengthy and in some cases expensive process, as all the cavity walls were insulated, roofs were fitted with insulating panels and lights were converted to LEDs. We are grateful to Synod for grants to help with this work. The church garden has flowers attractive to bees and insects, unused corners where bugs and hedgehogs flourish and hedges where blackbirds nest. Last year we planted a rowan tree as a demonstration of our commitment to addressing climate change. We added bird feeders and roosting nests to the existing trees.

In worship services, the newsletter and on the website, we have focused on environmental issues, climate change and Christian responsibility to care for the natural world. We are keeping track of the church's carbon footprint and encourage our members to do the same for their own homes and life style. One of our young members took part in the Extinction Rebellion demonstrations in London and reported back excitedly on her meeting with Greta Thunberg. We purchase environmentally friendly cleaning materials in bulk. The company supplying our new photocopier, hearing from us about Eco-Church, was keen to demonstrate its carbon neutral manufacture and highly efficient electricity use.

We know how difficult it will be to maintain the high standard we have set ourselves and to move forward into new areas. We pray for the Holy Spirit to guide us along this green pathway.

MILTON MOUNT FOUNDATION

Secondary Education

The Milton Mount Foundation offers bursaries to assist with the cost of secondary school fees to the children of Congregational and URC ministers, and also to the daughters of members of these churches.

Subject to the availability of sufficient funds, it may also be possible to provide grants to assist with the cost of school uniform and educational trips for ministers' children at both state and fee-paying schools.

Higher Education

Bursaries (currently £1,250 per annum) are offered to daughters of Congregational and URC ministers starting their first undergraduate degree in autumn 2020. Bursaries are also offered to those beginning a first postgraduate degree, for up to three years. Subject to sufficient funds being available, similar grants may also be available for sons of ministers.
