We looked at income and expenditure for 2019 and a full report is being prepared for Audit at present, with the draft figures being presented at Synod next month.

The Synod is now registered for 'Gift Aid' meaning that it will be possible to reclaim tax for any gifts of money from tax paying individuals, subject to the necessary 'form filling'.

We thought 2019 would be a difficult year to manage, and to some extent it was ending the year with a deficit, but this was much reduced from that of the agreed budget.

2020 will be another challenging year and it is very likely we will have some serious demands made on the planned budget. We go forward in the confidence of prayer that we can face the challenges together.
