

# E-LETTER NO: 268 – 10<sup>th</sup> MAY 2018 EDITED THIS WEEK BY: REVD CLIFF WINFIELD

Jesus said 'I am the good shepherd who is willing to die for the sheep' (John Ch.10v11). This was a very striking comment – one that the disciples would remember and others would wonder about. Shepherding was a very common and undesirable occupation; at the time of Jesus it was dangerous, low paid and the very unsociable hours meant they were outcasts in religious terms. However the 23<sup>rd</sup> Psalm pictures God as caring for the flock. David the youngest son of Jesse was a shepherd looking after sheep and became Israel's great warrior king and it was to a descendant of David that the people of Israel were to look for a Messiah.

Today we are not so familiar with the work of shepherds and it seems some are even using drones instead of sheep dogs! So I wondered what could be a modern parable? What occupation might Jesus use today to tell people about the kingdom of God? Could it have been the 'Good Bus Driver'? Here is a true story, I know, I was on the bus. My wife and I were travelling on a bus to Nottingham when it stopped for a couple, the lady was in a wheel chair. As they were showing their passes the lady asked the man if he had remembered the key to the caravan (they were going to catch a train to go to Skegness). Patting his pockets he confessed that he had not, so they would have to get off. The driver asked 'where is the key'? 'At home' came the reply, 'just around the corner'. So the driver said 'I'm a bit ahead of schedule – leave your wife here and fetch the key, I will wait', and that is what happened. You could say that the driver went the 'extra mile' without moving and none of the passengers complained.

A modern parable could be 'The Good Bus Driver', waits for people even if they are not exactly at the right stop. She gets you safely to your destination and cares for other road users and pedestrians. In our work, retirement and leisure we all need God's Holy Spirit to go that 'extra mile'. God needs you and I to care for those around us and those not in the flock. I used to be concerned that Jesus told the parable of the shepherd leaving 99 to look for one sheep (Mt.18:12), however I look at it this way now, Jesus wants the outcast to be safe in the fold as well.

WHY IS HOMELESSNESS RISING? – A presentation by Pam Orchard at West Derbyshire URC on Sunday 20th May at 3pm. Official figures show a rise in rough sleeping in the UK every year for the past 7 years. In fact across the UK, all types of homelessness is increasing including

numbers of people in temporary accommodation such as B&B's and hostels. Pam has worked in homelessness for 15 years and is the CEO at The Connection at St Martins in central London. She will outline what are the main causes of homelessness, different types of homelessness, why homelessness is rising and some of the responses required which would tackle the problem.

The session will include a combination of presentation and discussion.
