It's not often that I come across a book that I find hard to put down, but recently I've been reading "My journey so far" which describes the remarkable life and ministry of Andrew White, perhaps better known as "The Vicar of Baghdad." Although brought up in a Christian family, his father was a staunch Calvinist and his mother was from an Assemblies of God Pentecostal background. On a Sunday he attended a Strict Baptist Church and Sunday School and then in the afternoon and evening attended services at the Assemblies of God. When in Primary School he was asked what he wanted to be when he grew up, he replied an anaesthetist and a priest. Leaving School, despite poor health he qualified as an anaesthetist and worked successfully at St Thomas' Hospital in London. Whilst there he felt a strong calling to become a priest in the Church of England, despite the fact that he had not been confirmed and thought most Anglicans were not Christians! He went on to be a parish priest before becoming heavily involved in peace and reconciliation first at Coventry Cathedral and then in the Middle East despite being diagnosed with Multiple Sclerosis. It's an incredible story of how he has overcome many difficulties and has had an incredibly varied ministry.

NEWS FROM JENNIE CRANE (CRCW) AT CASTLE HILL

I finally finished my Level 1, 2 and 3 for Kitchen Supervisors just before Christmas, in the early New Year I was approached by Elsie's Café, they are a part of a national initiative which 'rescue' food that is heading for landfill sites, the food has reached the end of its sell by date but, not use by date. We were asked if we would be agreeable to start a joint venture.

On the 29th January we opened up, food had been prepared and we had 2 customers! 5th February, not feeling disheartened we opened our doors and had 24 customers, 12th...... 30 and 19th 40!!!! We are all blown away by how Our Lord is blessing the work at CH, and, it is all being achieved by the generosity of supporters from the wider church and different communities.

We have volunteers from both CH URC, Street Church, Elsie's Café and the local community, we operate on a pay as you are able, so no-one is excluded.

This really has become an extension of the work we are doing on a Tuesday evening, what started 3 years ago as a small group has now extended to about 55. Many of which are of NFA and are reliant on hand outs as they are not entitled to benefits. We have also been donated a large amount of clothes,

these are also shared on a Tuesday.

I would like to take this opportunity to invite you along on a Friday for your lunch, we serve 11.30am - 1.30pm. As Jesus said: "The King will reply, 'Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me.'
