Ascension Day - and with it begins the Well Dressing season in Derbyshire. Tissington wells are decorated and blessed, ready for the thousands of visitors who flock to see the wells with their flower decorated panels, admire the houses and gardens, buy a cake from the Christian Aid stall and enjoy cream teas in the village hall. Thereafter for the next four months people in village after village across the county will put their imagination and craft skills to work to decorate their wells - no longer a source of water, except in Youlgrave, but a source of income. Well dressing means summer is beginning and with it the tourist industry gears up. The visitors to

grand stately homes and industrial heritage sites, the walkers and climbers, the motoring tourists and motorcyclists are a major source of income for the county. The churches get in on the action with flower festivals to accompany the well dressings and the offer of home-made cakes and fair trade tea to refresh weary travellers. They raise money of course, they are part of this industry, but they also bear witness to the risen and living Christ. As our churches prepare for the influx of visitors, pray for them as they prepare to offer not just tea but living water. "Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again; but whoever drinks the water I shall give will never again be thirsty. The water that I shall give will be a spring of water within them, welling up and bringing eternal life." (John 4, 13-14)

What's the point of Church? - What's the answer to that question if church is not already your home, your family, something you've always done, or the place where you find a sense of belonging? What would you say to a young person who has never been involved with church, or to someone who has left church because of a bad experience, or simply because it's boring, irrelevant and out-dated?

Here's an answer that works for me: "Come and be part of God's people, transformed by the gospel, making a difference for Christ's sake!" These are the words of the Catch the Vision statement, which is the answer the United Reformed Church gave to the question, "What's the point of our continuing as a separate denomination?"

Unless the Christian Church is making a Jesus-shaped difference in the lives of the communities, it has no business existing, and we as members cannot justify the amount of time, energy and money that we spend to keep it going. There is far too much poverty and need and pain in the world that ought rightfully demand our time, attention and resources.

Belonging to the church ought to mean being a part of a global family whose reason for existing is to change the world. That is what Jesus taught us to pray for: "Your Kingdom come; your will be done on earth ..." That's mission, and mission is Spirit-business. This study day will help equip you to ask the big questions about your mission and how you can make a difference, and to listen to discern where the Spirit is leading you and your church.
