- It is with regret that we inform you of the sad news that **Jim Reid** died on Thursday 19th May. Jim died peacefully at home surrounded by his family after a short battle against cancer. His funeral will be at Old Brumby United Church on Friday 3rd June at 2.15pm. Jim had been Secretary and Synod Rep at both Old Brumby United Church and prior to the amalgamation at St Andrews URC.
- We regretfully inform you of the death of the Revd Peter Geoffrey Blake Barker. Peter passed away peacefully in his sleep in hospital on 13th May. Peter has left his body to medical science. A thanksgiving service will be held at St Andrew's URC, Northey Avenue, Cheam, SM2 7HF, at 2pm on the 3rd of June. Peter was ordained as Minister of Word and Sacraments in Ghana by the Presbyterian Church of Ghana, in which he served from 1963 to 85. Upon his return to the UK, his ministry were at the following places: South Erewash Valley Group: URC churches in Derbyshire 1985 to 96;St Andrew's United Reformed Church, Cheam 1996 to 99; Trinity Congregation, Presbyterian Church of Ghana in South London 1998 to 2001. Peter served in much wider areas than these listed and on many and varied committees and wrote books, several of them related to Ghana. Until his demise and in his retirement, Peter was a member at StAndrew's Cheam for around 20 years.

What's the point of Church? - What's the answer to that question if church is not already your home, your family, something you've always done, or the place where you find a sense of belonging? What would you say to a young person who has never been involved with church, or to someone who has left church because of a bad experience, or simply because it's boring, irrelevant and

out-dated?

Here's an answer that works for me: "Come and be part of God's people, transformed by the gospel, making a difference for Christ's sake!" These are the words of the Catch the Vision statement, which is the answer the United Reformed Church gave to the question, "What's the point of our continuing as a separate denomination?"

Unless the Christian Church is making a Jesus-shaped difference in the lives of the communities, it has no business existing, and we as members cannot justify the amount of time, energy and money that we spend to keep it going. There is far too much poverty and need and pain in the world that ought rightfully demand our time, attention and resources.

Belonging to the church ought to mean being a part of a global family whose reason for existing is to change the world. That is what Jesus taught us to pray for: "Your Kingdom come; your will be done on earth ..." That's mission, and mission is Spirit-business. This study day will help equip you to ask the big questions about your mission and how you can make a difference, and to listen to discern where the Spirit is leading you and your church.
