

E-LETTER NO: 250 – 3<sup>rd</sup> AUGUST 2017 EDITED THIS WEEK BY: HELEN LIDGETT

In mid-July, the Moderators, Clerks and Treasurers of East Midlands, West Midlands, Wales and South Western Synods met together for their annual day conference in Birmingham. This year they were also joined by the General Secretary, John Proctor. It is not a formal meeting but an opportunity to share visions and priorities and identify areas with the potential for co-operation. Inevitably deployment was at the forefront of everyone's mind. As numbers of ordained ministers decline steeply over the next few years, how are we planning to provide ministry for our churches in future? The problem is the same for all Synods but the solutions vary. Resource churches, flexible pastorates, group pastorates with team ministry, local lay leaders, 'bidding' for part of a minister's time for a particular piece of work and transitional ministry are all in the frame. Alongside this all four Synods are reviewing their committee and staffing structures, or have recently restructured, to improve the support they offer to local churches.

We continue to identify areas where we can cooperate. Although the three-Synod youth camp this summer had to be cancelled due to lack of numbers, some alternative joint events are in preparation. We raised the possibility of East Midlands offering some of its listed buildings expertise to West Midlands. Wales offers training in conducting funerals using the package 'Good Grief'.

After two Synods reported that they will be closing several churches this year, John Proctor asked a challenging question: are any of you opening any new churches? We shared news of mission projects: the 'church without walls' in Milton Keynes, a worshipping community on the outskirts of St Neots, ministry to a town rather than a church in Devon and the ecumenical project in the new housing development at Lubbesthorpe, near Leicester. John's challenge is one for us all to reflect on. Can we move from focussing on decline to creating opportunities for growth?

#### **AUTHORISATION TO PRESIDE AT THE SACRAMENTS**

To help clarify the position as to who can preside at the Sacraments, I have been in touch with Revd Michael Hopkins, Clerk to General Assembly to confirm what the denomination's present position is. The only people who can preside at the Sacraments without permission from the Synod are ordained URC Ministers of Word and Sacrament, or ordained ministers of other recognized denominations. No lay person has the authority to preside in any church, other than those which have specifically made a request to Synod for them to preside. Requests from a local church may be for an Elder of their church, or a lay preacher well-known to the congregation, who has been recognized at either National or Synod level and has received training approved by the Synod. Hannah Holmes maintains the Synod database of who is at present authorized and for which Church and she

### REFORMATION COMMEMORATION ECUMENICAL SERVICE


