Like a good number of Churches, Marlpool URC (Heanor, Derbyshire) has seen a decline in the number of persons attending Sunday Services over the last few years. We average about 30 to 40 attendees at the moment.

However, the concept of Church can be quite a narrow interpretation if it is dependent on those attending on Sunday mornings. We have various Church Groups that meet during the week:

PME (standing for a pleasant Monday experience!) which consists of ladies connected with the Church. They have a range of activities which they find worthwhile and challenging.

The Theatre Company consisting of Church and non-Church members who interact with a variety of Church activities, their next challenge being a concert and a performance of Saints Alive, a musical written by Roger Jones, and this will be linked with a Flower Festival organised by Church members.

The weekly Lunch Club organised by Church members and friends for a group of about 40 Elderly people with transport provided.

A Knit and Natter group consisting of a group of ladies who do produce some goods for sending to those in need.

The Brownies who occasionally take part in Sunday worship.

The Dance Classes run twice a week with some links to the Church Community.

The Noah's Ark Playgroup on a Friday morning, run by Church members and it usually attracts up to 30 children plus accompanying adults.

So, we consider all of the above as part of our Church and we seek to ensure we have good contacts with those who attend and we are there in times of need. Many of those attending the Groups say they feel part of the Church Community.

Naturally we work to ensure Sunday Services are child and adult friendly and we believe we still have work to do for the surrounding community.

I know when I gain information on other Churches in the Synod they have a similar approach and have considerable success in working with their local communities.

May we all take every opportunity to spread the Good News in many different ways.

WHY IS HOMELESSNESS RISING? — A presentation by Pam Orchard at West Derbyshire URC on Sunday 20th May at 3pm. Official figures show a rise in rough sleeping in the UK every year for the past 7 years. In fact across the UK, all types of homelessness is increasing

including numbers of people in temporary accommodation such as B and Bs and hostels. Pam has worked in homelessness for 15 years and is the CEO at The Connection at St Martins in central London. She will outline what are the main causes of homelessness, different types of homelessness, why homelessness is rising and some of the responses required which would tackle the problem.

The session will include a combination of presentation and discussion.
