A modern Doubting Thomas

I go cycling with a small group and we call ourselves the 'Flat Earth' cyclists as we try to avoid hills. We were on the 'Cloud Trail' which is mostly flat being an old railway track but near Worthington we were struggling up a hill but managed to pass a family also struggling with Mum pushing her youngest up on his small bike. At the top when we had recovered our breath we asked where is Worthington? We could see it but how could we get there! We also agreed that a pub or cafe was urgently required.

What goes up must come down and sure enough the next right turn led us downhill into the village. Freewheeling downhill is great - I love to feel the wind rushing through my hair! I was wearing my cycle hat but am lacking in hair! However the pub did not open till four and no sign of a cafe or shop!! Having left the family behind, we pushed on in search of a shop. It was truly out of the way and up another hill!! We purchased our ice lollies then it crossed my mind that the family might not find the shop and it was up another hill so I walked to the junction and waited to tell the good news. Soon enough they arrived and all of us enjoyed our refreshments in the afternoon sun. This was just a small incident on a longish (for us) ride.

How does this illustrate a modern 'doubting Thomas'? Well a few days later at a meal with a larger group of friends I was sitting next to one of my fellow cyclists and he was telling me how he had lost his faith. He had believed in the past but not anymore. I said that doubt was something we all felt at one time or another. Also that doubt was not the same as lack of faith. However my words were not as powerful as the incident on the cycle ride going back to tell the family where the shop was! He recounted the episode to others who were not on the ride.

This is surely true for us all - our actions make more impression than our words. In the words of Teresa of Avila: Yours are the only eyes through which his compassion can shine forth upon a troubled world.

We read in John 20: 19 – 31 that Thomas said 'Unless I see the marks of the nails and put my hand in his side. I will not believe'. **Jesus** gave Thomas the proof he asked for and he was able to declare 'My Lord and my God'. **Jesus** said 'you believe because you have seen me. Blessed are those who have not seen yet believe'. That is you and I. It is a wonderful privilege and responsibility to be a follower of **Jesus** and let his **Holy Spirit** shine through us.
