Opening Reflection by the Revd Geoff Townsend



Given all the present restrictions it seems highly appropriate that for the February issue of <u>Reform</u>, the question was asked, "<u>How will churches look after the pandemic?</u>" One of those asked was the Synod's own Pioneer Minister in Milton Keynes, **Ruth Maxey**. In **Church Without Walls**, Ruth has already broken

the traditional concept of Church – for when restrictions allow, Sunday worship might be either Quiet Church, Forest Church, Dinner or Café Church.

Stories of the Church's resistance to change are endless. Many years ago when I was serving in the North West Synod, I shared in an ecumenical service for the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity with **Bishop John Finney**, the Suffragan Bishop of Pontefract, who has just been appointed by the Church of England as their Officer for the Decade of Evangelism. He told of a visit he made to an isolated parish in the wilds of the Yorkshire Dales. He arrived earlier than anticipated but found the church open and got in conversation with an elderly farmer who told him he had been Church Warden for over 40 years. "You must have seen many changes," said the Bishop. "Yes, and I've opposed every one," replied the Church Warden.

Today with worship in church not being possible, increasingly churches are turning to Zoom and as time has gone on, numbers in many cases have started to increase, although for some it's the opportunity to share news before and after the service that is the attraction. For some churches Zoom is also being used for Bible Studies, Prayer Meetings and Coffee mornings.



Many churches are having to rely on their financial reserves as lockdown has meant that relied-upon income from lettings has ceased. The Synod's Finance Networkers and Pastoral Consultants are there to help, so please do not hesitate to contact them.

Gradually there are some distant glimmers of hope that as the numbers of those receiving vaccinations increase, some of the present restrictions will be eased, but the jury is out whether what was once "normal" will return.

As Winston Churchill said, "There's nothing wrong with change.....if it's in the right direction."

It was conducted by East Midlands Synod Moderator the **Revd Geoffrey Clarke** with the participation of the **Revd Robert Bushby**, Interim Moderator and **Barbara Moses** on site and several other contributors online.

The Pioneer Ministry is an ecumenical mission project supported by the Anglican, Methodist and United Reformed Churches, to develop ministry to the major new housing developments in Bracebridge Heath and Canwick where 3,500 new homes are expected to be built by 2036.

We share in the joy of this important moment for **Matt**, his wife **Sasha** and daughter **Cara** and pray they will be richly blessed as they embark on this exciting new venture. The North Derbyshire Resource Area comprises Buxton, Tideswell, Holymoorside, St Andrew's Rose Hill and Calow URCs, with Wirksworth envisaged to join the Area in fullness of time. Camilla now serves Wirksworth 25% of her time and the North Derbyshire Area for another 25%, with a further 25% devoted to her work as Clerk of the East Midlands Synod. When a full-time minister has been called to the Resource Area, currently in vacancy, Camilla will work with that minister.

We congratulate Camilla as she assumes this new role of supporting, equipping and encouraging these churches and pray that all her work may be fruitful.

Personal News

We have received news of the deaths in recent days of several significant figures in the **East Midlands Synod**. It is with deep sadness, then, that we report the following. We remember their families and friends in our prayers.

Gwen Balding died on 21 January 2021. Born in December 1913, Gwen was the widow of the **Revd Alan Balding**, who served the East Midlands Synod until his death in 1989. She had moved from London to Newport Pagnell in 1958 with her two young sons Roger and Frank after the death of her first husband Arthur, also a minister, and attended Newport Pagnell Congregational Church. She married Alan in 1965. She is survived by Frank and three generations of grandchildren.

The **Revd Ralph Leonard Eveleigh** died on Monday 25 January 2021, following some years of declining health. Ralph served at: Bush Hill Park (1964-72); Clacton-on-Sea (1972-84); Ealing Green (1984-92); in the Wellingborough Group (1992-99); as Link Minister for Great Doddington (2007-08); and at Dean (1999-2012). Ralph's wife died in September 2020; they are survived by their family. John Shaw died on Wednesday 27 January 2021 at the Glenfield Hospital, following some years of declining health. John was Local Church Leader at Westcotes URC, Leicester and served many other churches in Leicestershire as an Assembly Accredited Lay Preacher. Following a private cremation, his family and church hope to hold a Memorial Service when circumstances permit.

Sheila Watson died on Tuesday 2 February 2021, following a stroke and after contracting Covid-19. Alongside her husband the **Revd Douglas Watson**, retired Non-Stipendiary Minister at Burton Joyce, Nottingham, Sheila was known to many in the Synod from the bookshop she and Douglas ran at Synod Meetings and at the Synod Office. She is survived by Douglas and their family.

The **Revd Peter McIntosh** (Southern Synod) died on Monday 25 January 2021. Peter served at: Byker (1968-74); Priory Green (1974-76); the Elephant Group, London (1978-84); Christ Church, Dulwich (1984-90); as Southern Province Training Officer (1987-92); Portslade & Hounsom Memorial, Hove (1992-94); as Director of the Windermere Centre (1994-2001); as Moderator of General Assembly (1999-2000); and as Director of Lomas House (2001-03). He is survived by his wife Kay. His funeral was due to be held at Haywards Heath Methodist Church. Practical Advice for Churches

Our Synod Property Officer **Geoff Milnes** draws the attention of all Church Secretaries and Property Officers to the following:

Electrical Tests on Manses

There is some legislation which affects electrical safety of Manses which comes in to force on 1 April this year – and no, I am not joking!

An 'Electrical Installation Condition Report' will be required on all let properties from 1 April. It will be valid for five years and will then need to be renewed. This is similar to the Landlord's Gas Certificates which are required but last for a year. The Trust has decided that it will be good practice to have Manses that are occupied by Ministers or CRCWs to have this Report carried out as well – after all, they are occupiers of Church property, as are tenants.

Please arrange to have these Reports carried out as soon as possible, and before 1 April for tenanted Manses, so that we comply with the law but also ensure that our properties are safe for our Ministers as well as our tenants.

I understand that the cost should be around £120 - 150 + VAT, but you will need to get quotations before proceeding.

The **Methodist Homestead Charitable Trust** operates 24 independent living almshouse cottages in Northampton providing a small ecumenical Christian community for those of retirement age in its own peaceful grounds; personal and nursing care are not provided by the charity.

The Trustees are seeking to fill two vacancies that will be created when the current job holders retire in May 2021 for:

A **Warden** who will be a caring, flexible person providing support and assistance to our residents.
